Carrie Lee Odom age 74 of Fayetteville, GA passed on January 4, 2021. She was born in Portland, OR to Johnny Brewster and Susie Lee McCurry. She was a resident of Alaska for over 40 years and later moved to Fayetteville, Ga. Carrie graduated from East High School and attended Wayland Baptist University in Anchorage, Alaska.

Carrie loved God and was devoted to the ministry. She was a prayerful woman who always had a word of encouragement to all who knew her. Her faith sustained her and uplifted others. She was Pastor of El Shaddai Ministry, a Spiritual Counselor, an Evangelist; and, through her ministry she led many to Christ. She was a Scholar of the bible and full of knowledge and wisdom which was shared through her bible study classes, Young People Willing Workers (YPWW), and Friday Night Youth Ministry. She was involved in the

Prison and Hospitality Ministry. In addition, she was active in many community and civic organizations. As a mother she was her Children's Queen. She made sure all her children were involved with sports, the arts and community activities but her greatest legacy was that her Children knew God.
