Our father Mr. Julian Leroy Carter, was born on March 10, 1944 to Eleanora Gittens Carter and Beltram Carter in Brooklyn, New York. He received his formal education at William E. Grady Vocational and Technical High School in Brooklyn, New York. Our father was an athlete and was the captain of the track and basketball team. His course of study was Cabinet Making. He received merited graduation and his diploma in June of 1962. November 12, 1964 he enlisted in the United States Army. He received his Marksman Badge for the Rifle. He also received the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and Vietnam Campaign Medal. His character of service was honorable.

Mr. Julian Leroy Carter was employed by Tribeca and Merrill Lynch as a chauffeur and driver for several years. In his leisure time he enjoyed going to the bowling alley. He was an avid and very talented bowler. He liked going to

parks, walking, casinos, playing cards with friends and traveling. He especially loved spending time with family and close friends.

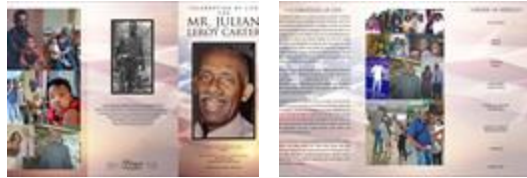
